The **École Polytechnique massacre** was an **antifeminist** mass shooting that occurred on December 6, 1989, at the École Polytechnique in **Montreal**, Canada. Fourteen women were murdered; another ten women and four men were injured. The perpetrator, **Marc Lépine**, entered a mechanical engineering class and separated the male and female students, ordering the men to leave. He shot all nine women in the room, killing six. The shooter then at the building, killing eight more women and wounding **eleven** others. The massacre is considered as
