The **École Polytechnique massacre** was an antifeminist mass shooting that occurred on December 6, 1989, at the **École Polytechnique** in **Montreal**, Canada. Fourteen women were murdered; another ten women and four men were injured. The perpetrator, **Marc Lépine**, entered a mechanical engineering class and separated the male and female students, ordering the men to leave. He shot all nine women in the room, killing six.
